



Peace be to this house, and to all who enter here: In the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The congregation standing, the Presiding Bishop begins the Prayer for the Consecration of the Church

Presiding Bishop Our help is in the Name of the Lord;

People The maker of heaven and earth.

Presiding Bishop Let us pray.

Everliving Father, watchful and caring, our source and our end: All that we are and all that we have is yours. Accept us now, as we dedicate this place to which we come to praise your Name, to ask your forgiveness, to know your healing power, to hear your Word, and to be nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son. Be present always to guide and to judge, to illuminate and to bless your people.

Kyle Martindale and Rachel Shows, Seminarians and Field Education Students at Immanuel Church-on-the-Hill, continue

Lord Jesus Christ, make this a temple of your presence and a house of prayer. Be always near us when we seek you in this place. Draw us to you, when we come alone and when we come with others, to find comfort and wisdom, to be supported and strengthened, to rejoice and give thanks. May it be here, Lord Christ, that we are made one with you and with one another, so that our lives are sustained and sanctified for your service.

Water is poured into the Font. Bishop Irish says

Bishop Irish The Lord be with you.

People And also with you.

Bishop Irish Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Facing the Font, Bishop Irish says

We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over it the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through it you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In it your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of Baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

Grant, by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who here are cleansed from sin and born again may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Savior.

1 Peter 2:1-9 Thomas Kerns

Rid yourselves, therefore, of all malice, and all guile, insincerity, envy, and all slander. Like newborn infants, long for the pure, spiritual milk, so that by it you may grow into salvation-if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good. Come to him, a living stone, though rejected by mortals yet chosen and precious in God's sight, and like living stones, let yourselves be built into a spiritual house, to be a holy priesthood, to offer spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ. For it stands in scripture: "See, I am laying in Zion a stone, a cornerstone chosen and precious; and whoever believes in him will not be put to shame." To you then who believe, he is precious; but for those who do not believe, "The stone that the builders rejected has become the very head of the corner," and "A stone that makes them stumble, and a rock that makes them fall." They stumble because they disobey the word, as they were destined to do. But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of him who called you out of darkness into his marvelous light.

THE MOST REVEREND JUSTIN WELBY THE 105TH ARCHBISHOP OF CANTERBURY



The people stand and say

THE NICENE CREED

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate: he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son.
With the Father and the Son he is worshiped and glorified. He has spoken through the Prophets.
We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins.
We look for the resurrection of the dead,
and the life of the world to come. Amen.

of your Creation; for wisdom and humility in our use of the good gifts of the earth; for an end to violence and exploitation between tribes, races, genders and nations. Heal our divisions, we pray, and open our hearts to seek the blessings of abundant life for all.

God of Love and Mercy

People Hear our prayer.

Intercessor God of resurrection and renewal, you call us out of the ashes

of grief and loss into new places beyond our imagining. We pray in love and in thanksgiving for this seminary community, for all whose hard work, vision and generosity have brought us to this day of celebration. Bless and guide our work here, as we seek to shape and serve your church. Open our hearts and minds to the unfolding mystery of your love, we pray; and as we continue on this journey together, give us grace to trust you; to believe your promises; and to follow faithfully where you lead.

God of healing, we pray for all who are sick, or lonely, or traumatized, and for all prisoners, refugees, and victims of violence. As we hold their needs in prayer, teach us, Lord Jesus, to be your hands, your heart and your voice of compassion in this broken world.

Presiding Bishop All this we ask in the name of our Saviour Jesus Christ, companion, teacher and lover of our souls, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, One God, now and forever.

Amen.

A period of silence is kept.

The Presiding Bishop concludes with the following prayers

Almighty God, all times are your seasons, and all occasions invite your tender mercies: Accept our prayers and intercessions offered in this place today and in the days to come; through Jesus Christ, our Mediator and Advocate. *Amen.*

We give you thanks, O God, for the gifts of your people, and for the work of many hands, which have beautified this place and furnished it for the celebration of your holy mysteries. Accept and bless all we have done, and grant that in these earthly things we may behold the order and beauty of things heavenly; through lesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The Presiding Bishop says

Let us now pray for the setting apart of the Altar.

The Presiding Bishop moves to the Table and, with arms extended, says

Presiding Bishop We praise you, almighty and eternal God, that for us and for

our salvation, you sent your Son Jesus Christ to be born among us, that through him we might become your sons

and daughters.

People Blessed be your Name, Lord God.

Presiding Bishop We praise you for his life on earth, and for his death upon

the cross, through which he offered himself as a perfect sacrifice.

People Blessed be your Name, Lord God.

Presiding Bishop We praise you for raising him from the dead, and for exalting

him to be our great High Priest.

People Blessed be your Name, Lord God.

Presiding Bishop We praise you for sending your Holy Spirit to make us holy,

and to unite us in your holy Church.

People Blessed be your Name, Lord God.

The Presiding Bishop lays a hand upon the Table, saying

Lord God, hear us. Sanctify this Table dedicated to you. Let it be to us a sign of the heavenly Altar where your saints and angels praise you for ever. Accept here the continual recalling of the sacrifice of your Son. Grant that all who eat and drink at this holy Table may be fed and refreshed by his flesh and blood, be forgiven for their sins, united with one another, and strengthened for your service.

People Blessed be your Name, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit; now and for endless ages. Amen.

Members of the congregation vest the Altar, place the vessels on it, and light the candles.


People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

Through Jesus Christ our great High Priest; in whom we are built up as living stones of a holy temple, that we might offer before you a sacrifice of praise and prayer which is holy and pleasing in your sight.

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

The people stand or kneel. The Presiding Bishop continues

We give thanks to you, O God, for the goodness and love which you have made known to us in creation; in the calling of Israel to be your people; in your Word spoken through the prophets; and above all in the Word made flesh, Jesus, your Son. For in these last days you sent him to be incarnate from the Virgin Mary, to be the Savior and Redeemer of the world. In him, you have delivered us from evil, and made us worthy to stand before you. In him, you have brought us out of error into truth, out of sin into righteousness, out of death into life.

On the night before he died for us, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: This is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me." After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore, according to his command, O Father,

We remember his death,
We proclaim his resurrection,
We await his coming in glory.

The Presiding Bishop continues

And we offer our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving to you, O Lord of all; presenting to you, from your creation, this bread and this wine.

We pray you, gracious God, to send your Holy Spirit upon these gifts that they may be the Sacrament of the Body of Christ and his Blood of the new Covenant. Unite us to your Son in his sacrifice, that we may be acceptable through him, being sanctified by the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time, put all things in subjection under your Christ, and bring us to that heavenly country where, with all your saints, we may enter the everlasting heritage of your sons and daughters; through Jesus Christ our Lord, the firstborn of all creation, the head of the Church, and the author of our salvation.

By him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and for ever. *Amen.*






