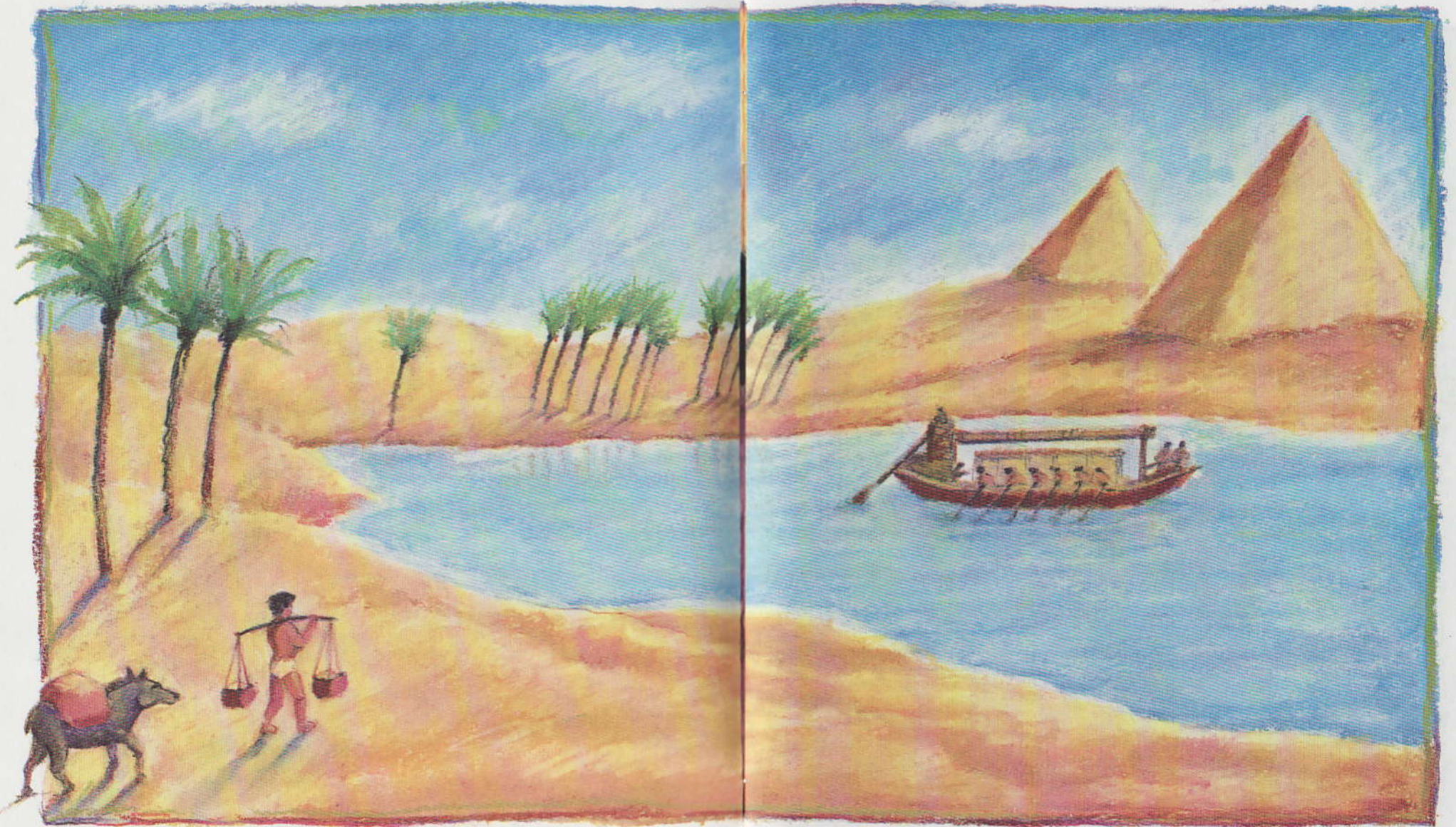


MOSES



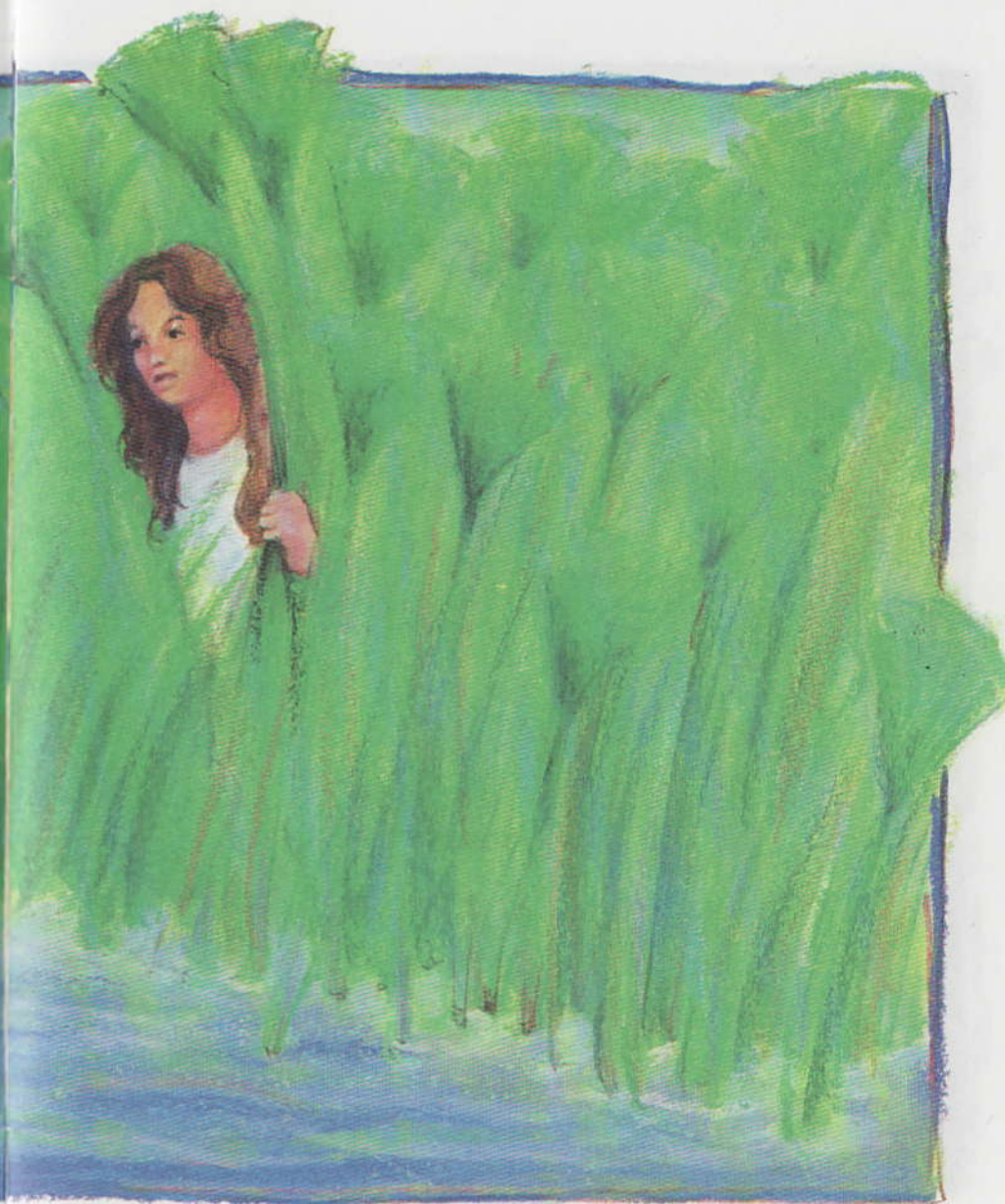


Moses was a child of God
whose great adventure began

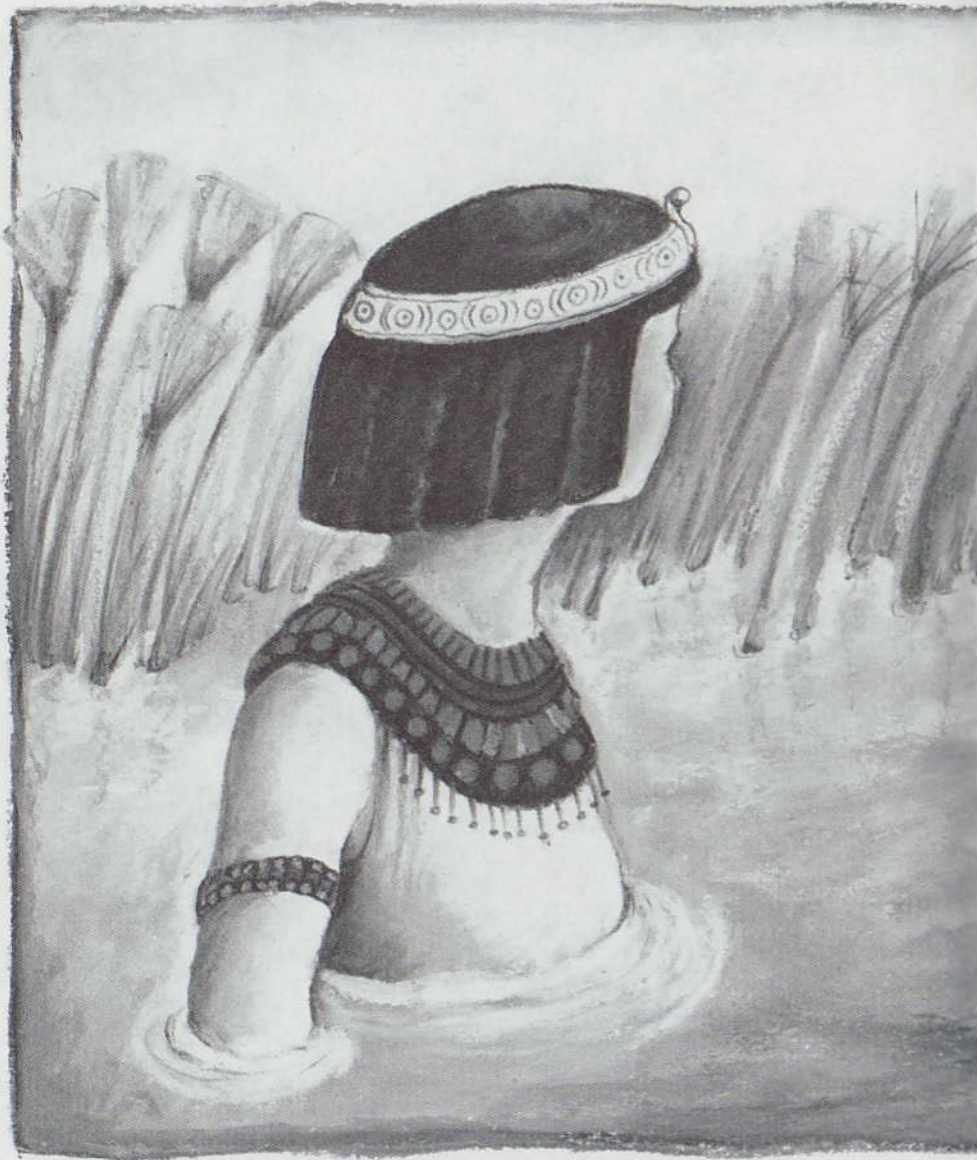
when he was only three months old

She pulled it from the water

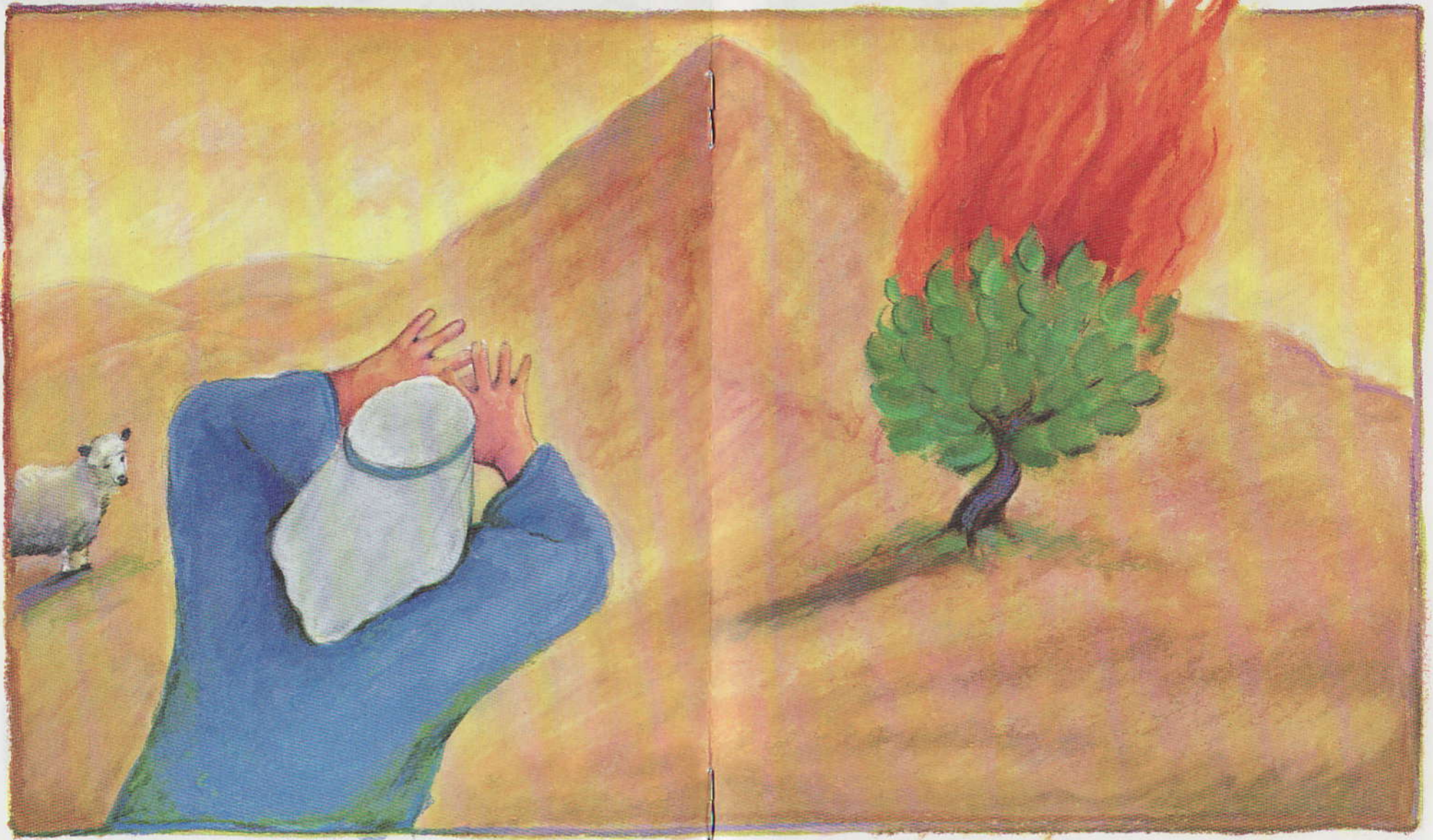
and cared for the baby's needs.

that you are standing by."

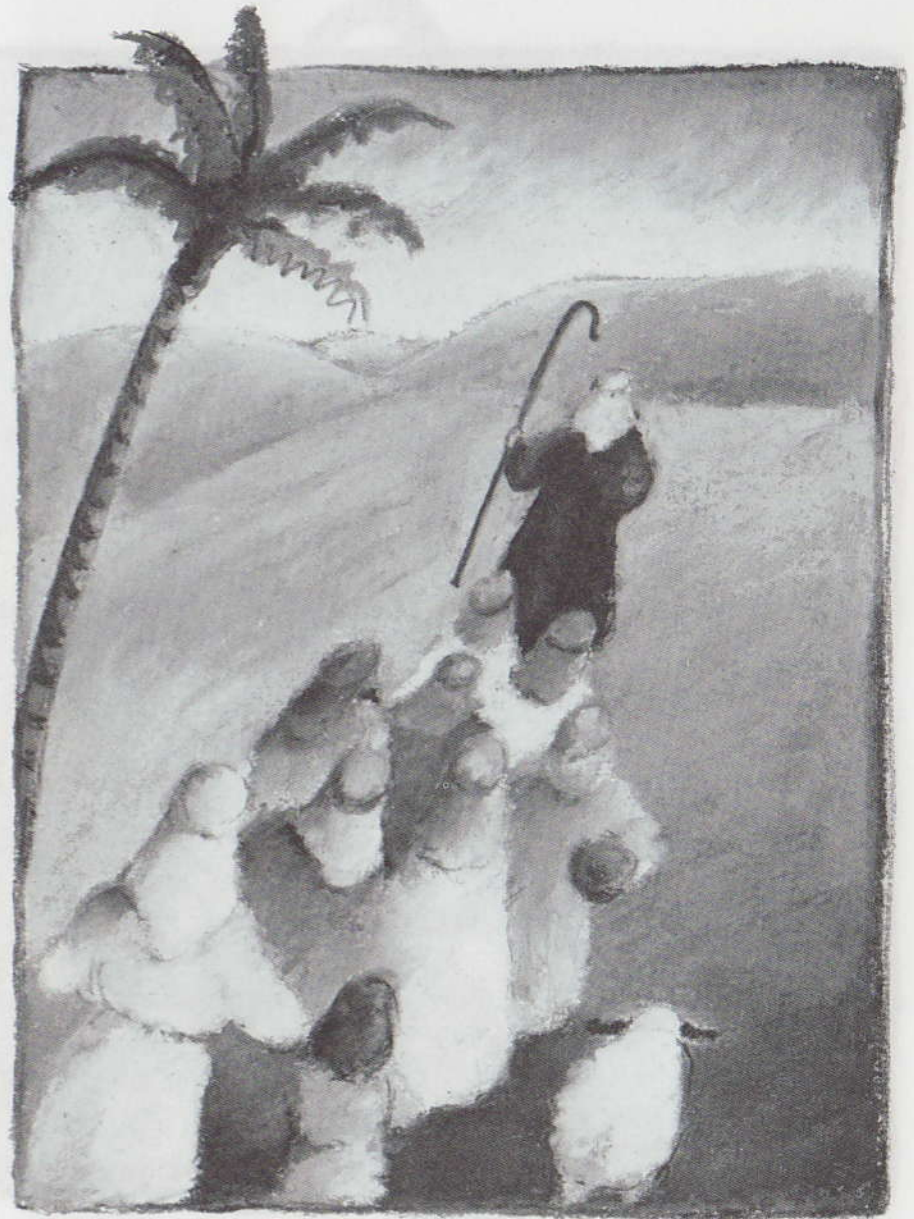


God gave Moses

His final word was "No!"

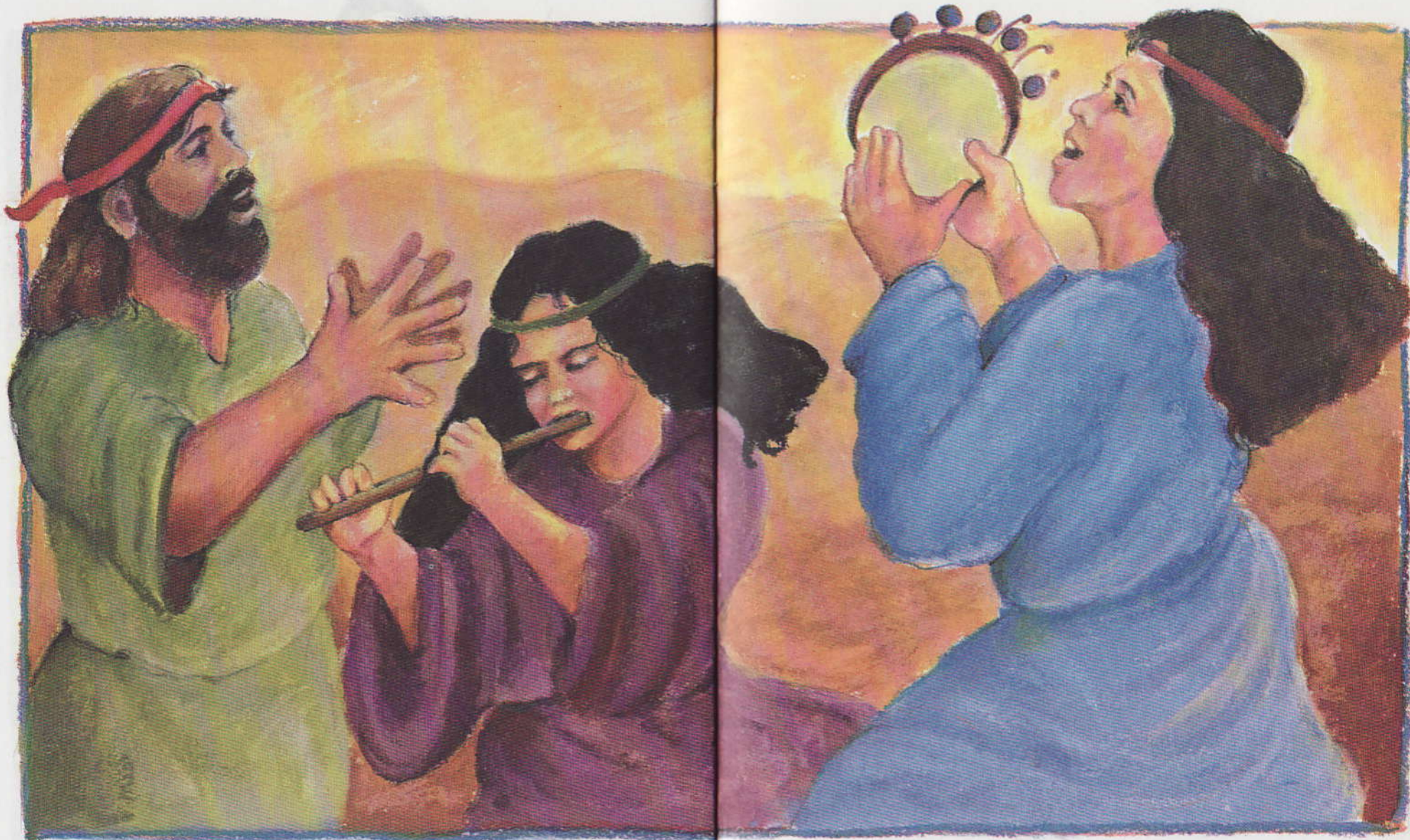


Moses led the Hebrews
