Confession of Sin

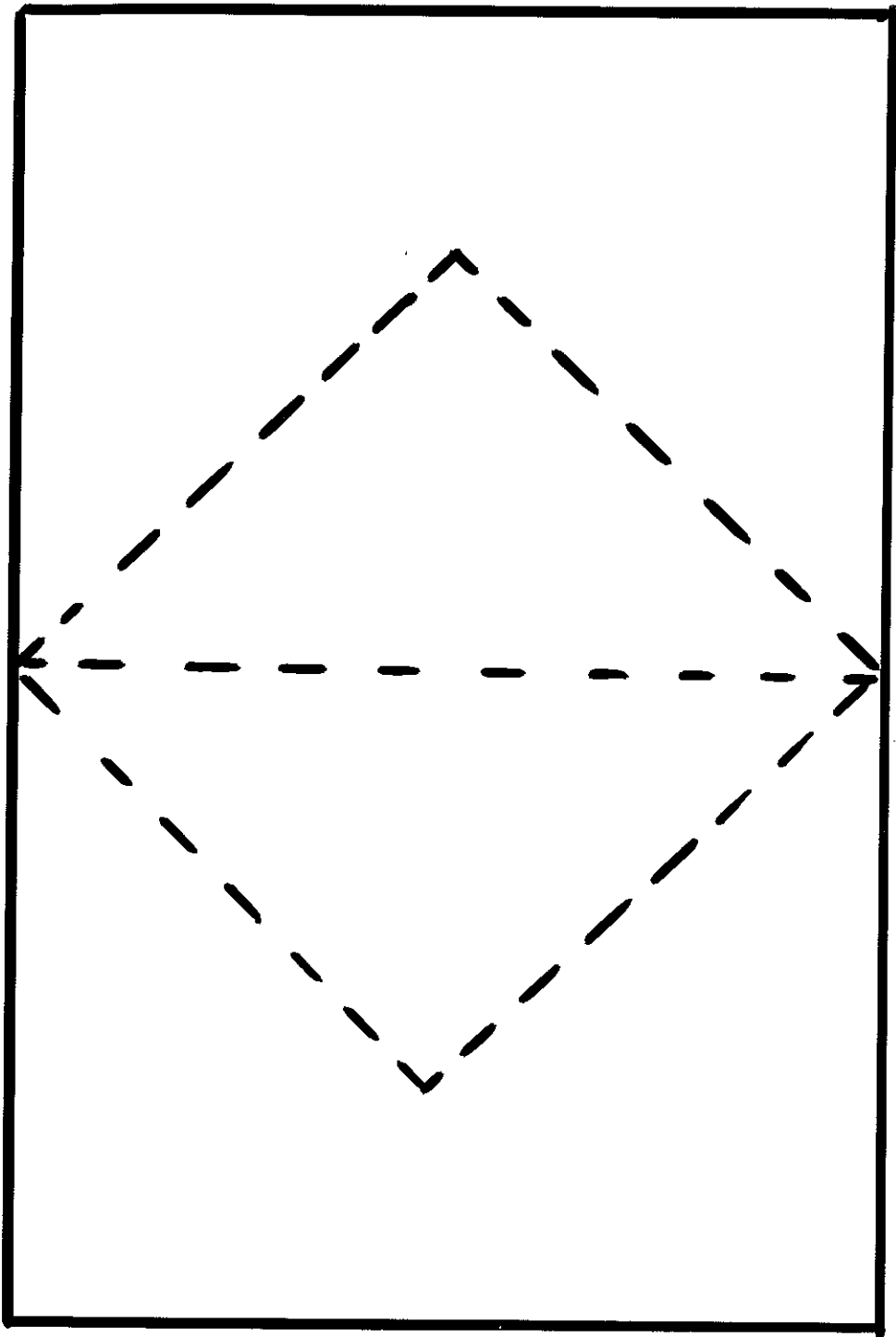
Most merciful God,

Mitre instructions:

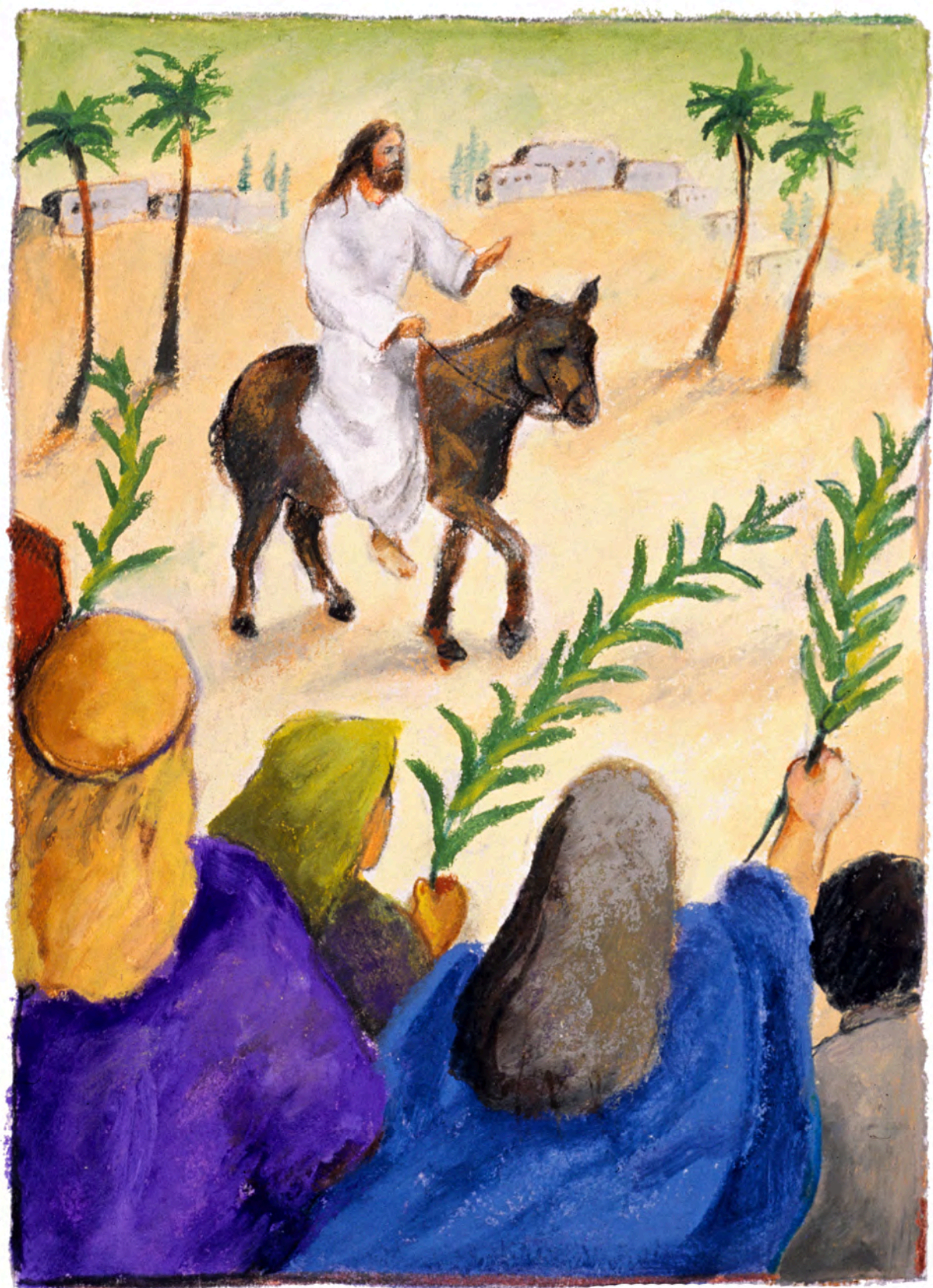
Cut along solid lines, and fold along dotted lines to create a mitre.



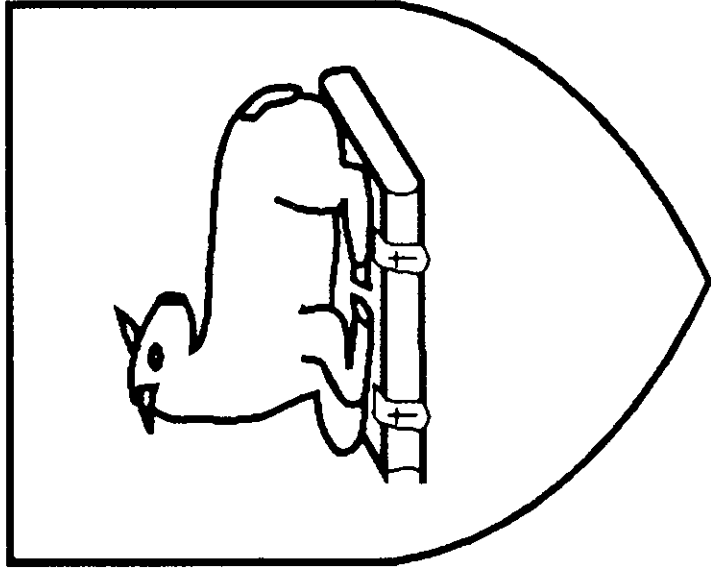






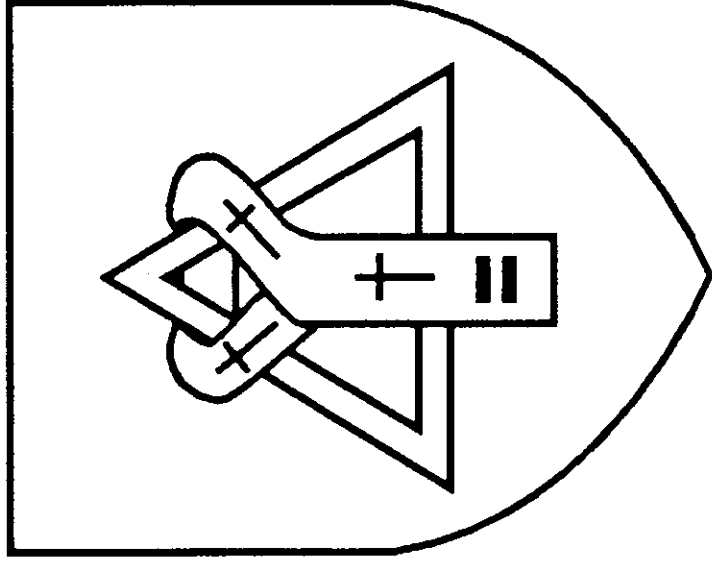

A Prayer attributed to St. Francis

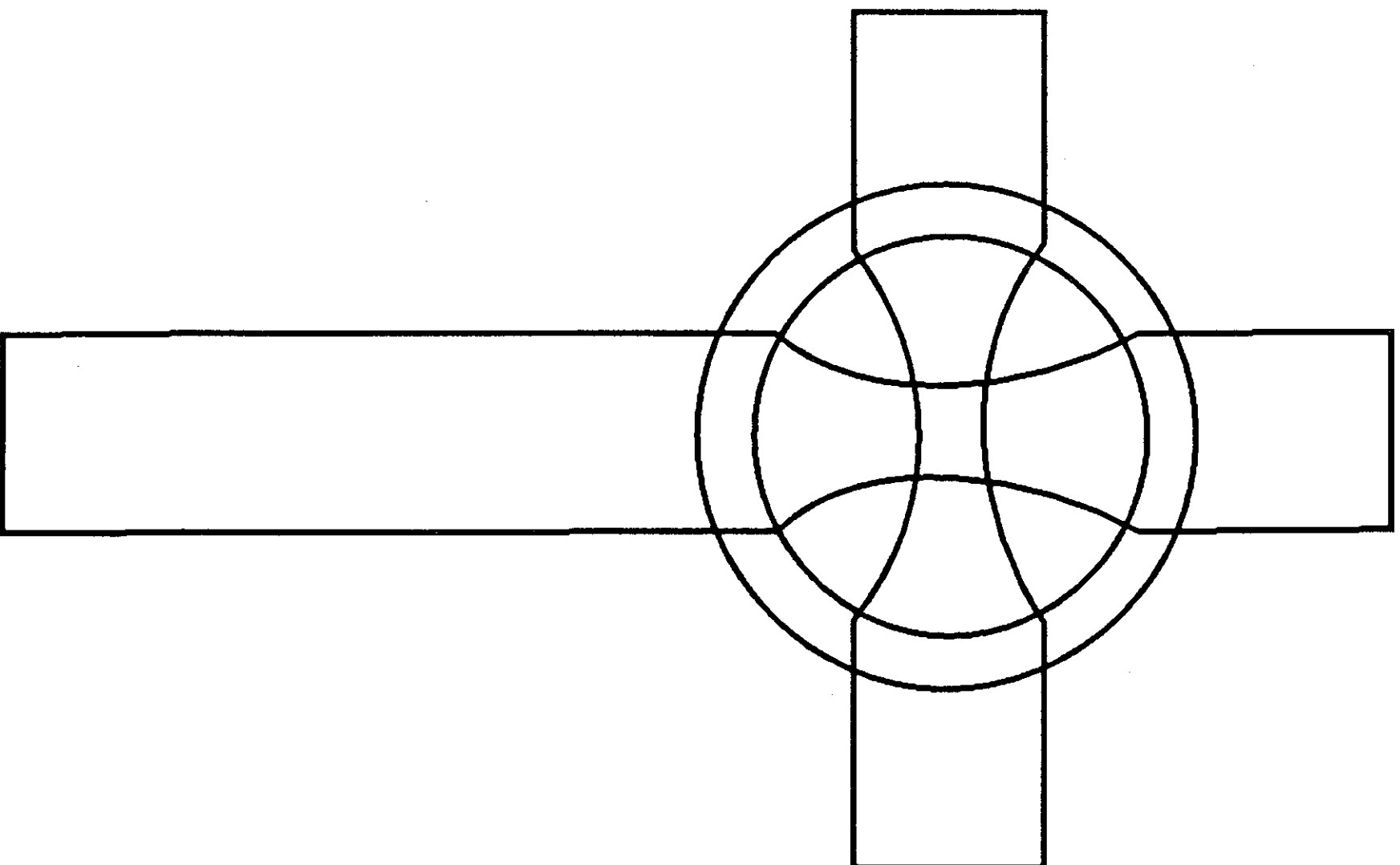
**Lord, make us instruments of your peace.
